

WILLOW OAK *(Quercus phellos)*



Willow Oaks are suitable for medium to large areas, and differentiate themselves from other oaks with their unusual leaves. Instead of wide leaves with lobes, Willow Oaks have many slender leaves that are approximately 5" long, but only about 1" wide. The leaves are light to bright green in summer, and yellow, yellow-brown, and russet in fall. The Willow Oak exhibits a relatively fast growth rate, and prefers acid soil and full sun. The Willow Oak can tolerate poorly drained soil. The tree grows to a height of 40'-60' on average, with a canopy width of usually no more than 35'.
